Between 1957-58, I Nadia (Hradowy) Michaluk went to Immaculate Heart of Mary Academy on Redwood and Main for grade 9-10.

My home town was Inwood, Manitoba. Since we were out of town three of us girls stayed there. The Sisters lived upstairs and we lived downstairs.

I remember on the day of Registration when the Sister took pictures of us three, standing by the school.

There were paths along the River, and we would go for walks and see the beautiful scenery and all kinds of birds singing.

My parents Michael and Anna brought fresh chicken meat and eggs from the farm to help pay for my stay.

Sister Bernard and Sister Angelica taught us. They were very nice to us and to other students. Sister Bernard was older and Sister Angelica much younger. I think she just started.

Now the Home is occupied by "Sister Servants".

We would always walk across the yard to Holy Family Home to eat. Whenever Sisters made Headcheese, they would invite us to feast on the meat that was left around the bones.

Those were the days I remember and never forgotten.

I now go to Sts. Peter and Paul Church in St. Boniface.

There were also the Sisters that lived in Komarno, Manitoba. When I was small, my parents and I went to Sisters Home for Sunday Liturgy. There was only once a month Liturgy at the Church.

In summer the Sisters taught us Catechism. My father would take us in the morning, and pick us up at 3:30. I loved going to Sisters Home, and told my Mom I'd like to be a nun just like them. They also took care of sick people.
